A crisp, dry wine with the fuller style typical of this popular grape variety.

Germany, Mosel

Juicy, off dry Riesling with a whole fruit salad of flavours: apple, lemon, peach, lime and pear to name but a few

Drylands – Sauvignon Blanc. £25.00

New Zealand, Marlborough

Ripe, rich herbal and tropical fruit flavours combine in a vibrant burst of flavour on the palate.

Domaines Brocard – Chablis Premier Cru. £33.00

France Burgundy

Classis Floral aromas of Premier Cru Chablis with delicious citrus and mineral flavours on the finish.

Sancerre Château de Sancerre, Marnier-Lapostolle £37.50

France

Classic elegance evolves into a classic grassy vibrancy that develops citrus honeyed hints with age.

Château du Seuil, Graves - Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc. £44.50

France. Bordeaux – Graves.

A blend of 60% Semillon and 40% Sauvignon Blanc. Part of the Semillon portion is fermented in new French oak barriques. A wine with great depth in the classic mould of a top Graves

Puligny-Montrachet, Louis Jodot - Grand Vin de Bourgogne £63.00

France

Elegant, refined and very classic, shows the firmness required from a wine of this highly regarded estate.



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Champagne and Sparkling

Carr Taylor. Brut. £29.00

England, Westfield.

Dry, Pale golden with subtle aromas of fresh apple and elderflower. Bottle maturation provides hints of biscuit on the nose and butter on the palate. Carr Taylor vineyard is located less than a mile from here and has won numerous international awards.

Carr Taylor Brut Rosé Sparkling £29.00

England, Westfield

Delicate flavours of ripe summer red berries and fresh cherries. Carr Taylor vineyard is located less than a mile from here and has won numerous international awards.

House Champagne n.v. £37.50

France, Champagne.

Moet and Chandon Brut Imperial n.v. £50.00

France, Champagne.

Classily a third each of Pinot Noir, Pinot Meunier and Chardonnay are matured for at least 3 years in the bottle which helps give the wine its typical biscuity flavour.

Taittinger Brut Reserve n.v. £55.00

France, Champagne.

Taittinger has long been known for the lightness and elegance of it's champagnes. The brut NV shows these characteristics to perfection. It receives 3 – 4 years ageing prior to release results in subtle hints of biscuit and brioche.

Perrier Jouet Grand Brut n.v. £57.50

France, Champagne.

Slightly Floral and honeyed fruit aromas. It shows fresh fruit such as white peaches on the palate with an elegant finish.

Taittinger Prestige Brut Rosé n.v. £65.00

France, Champagne

A delicate pink wine with flavour redolent of ripe summer fruits.

Louis Roederer Cristal Brut Vintage 1999 £200.00

France, Champagne.

The jewel of the Louis Roederer house created for Tsar Alexander II in 1876. A drastic selection of the best pinot Noir and Chardonnay from the House's 10 most celebrated 'crus' are employed in the production of this legendary wine. Expect to detect delicate aromas of brioche, nuts balanced with notes of lemon peel, nectarines and peaches.

Mateau Rose – Sogrape n.v. £17.50

Portugal

Medium Dry rose wine with just a hint of a sparkle

Cotés du Rhone Louis Bernard, Cuvée des Prélats £19.00

France, Southern Rhone.

Soft and Peppery, typically warm, ripe flavoured wine.

Fleurie. £22.50

France, Beaujolais Villages.

Here the classic Gamay grape produces fruity, silky reds with strong scents – representative of the real spirit of the region.

Chianti £23.00

Italy, Toscana

Light- medium bodied using Sangiovese and Canaiolo grapes it shows floral and fruity notes that lead towards spicy scents of white pepper and hazelnuts.

The Gumnut Shiraz £25.00

SE Australia

Rich, smooth blackberries mingle with black cherries and all topped off with a bit of spice.

Robert Skalli Reserve – Pinot Noir, VdP de Lile de Beauté £27.00

France, Vignobles

Matured in oak barrels this rich and intense Pinot Noir has elegant blueberry and black cherry fruit, backed by a smooth finish with spicy notes.

Faustino I. Rioja Gran Reserva. £37.00

Spain, Rioja

This is matured for 25-30 months in American oak barrels before a minimum of 3 years in bottle. Mature, velvety smooth with great complexity. The flagship of the Faustino range.



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Châteauneuf du Pape – Skalli La Fiare du Pape **£42.00**

France, Rhone

A robust wine with great richness of fruit and complexity. Made using a blend of mainly Grenache, Syrah, Mourvèdre and a range of lesser known grapes local to the region like Counoise, Terret Noir, Muscardin and Vaccarèse.

Château du Seuil, Graves **£44.50**

France. Bordeaux – Graves.

The most successful wine from Château du Seuil and a long-standing favourite on our list. A blend of about 50% Cabernet Sauvignon and 50% Merlot, some of which undergoes a primary fermentation in barrel, along with pre- and post-fermentation skin contact and 'lees' stirring. The wine is aged for about 18 months in French oak barrels of which 30% is new. An elegant and concentrated, fruity wine with integrated oak flavours and firm, rounded tannins.

Château Notton - Margaux. **£59.00**

France, Bordeaux, Margaux

An elegant wine from a property owned by Henri Lurton, who is also the proprietor of second-growth Château Brane-Cantenac. This vineyard with 70% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc, is typical of the Médoc; the wine is fermented in stainless steel and aged in French oak (20% new) for about a year. A rich, well-structured wine.

Pierre Amiot - Clos de la Roche, 1995 **£89.50**

France, Burgundy Morey-Saint-Denis,

The nose is deeply pitched with an aromatic spectrum that runs more toward black and blue fruit aromas tinged with obvious earth and spice notes that can also be found on the rich, full and intense full-bodied flavors that possess a structured finish that is strikingly long.

Grand Vin de Château Latour - 1er Grand Cru Classé 1997 **£350.00**

France, Bordeaux, Pauillac

The 1997 Latour will be one of the longest lived offerings of the vintage. It possesses lots of tannin and depth, along with medium to full body, and a textured, multidimensional personality. Sweet, jammy fruit is intertwined with dried herbs, coffee, and earth in this saturated ruby/purple-colored wine.

Château Lafite-Rothschild - 1er Grand Cru Classé 1995 **£1200.00**

France, Bordeaux, Pauillac

The 1995 Lafite-Rothschild (only one-third of the harvest made it into the final blend) is a blend of 75% Cabernet Sauvignon, 17% Merlot, and 8% Cabernet Franc. It exhibits a dark ruby purple color, and a sweet, powdered mineral, smoky, weedy cassis-scented nose. Beautiful sweetness of fruit is present in this medium-bodied, tightly-knit, but gloriously pure, well-delineated Lafite.
